Street Outreach Program

Services meet the immediate needs of street youth while seeking long-term solutions. Staff combine education and intervention to teach daily life skills. These tools empower youth to take greater control of their circumstances in a positive manner.

Program Highlights:

- Referral/Linkage
- Transportation
- Survival Aid
- Reduction/Prevention of sexual exploitation
- Employment seeking
- Access to health care and nutrition
- Linkage to short and long term housing
- Independent living skills
- Positive adult connections



Transitional Living Program

The Transitional Living Program (TLP) is for youth ready to take the initiative to better his or her own life. YSB case managers work closely with TLP clients to provide guidance and to help them accomplish the goals they set for themselves.

TLP residents are required to work, attend school or perform community service for a minimum of 30 hours per week. Youth are encouraged to become responsible and learn the skills necessary to become independent adults.

- Safe and stable long term living accommodations

 - Menu planning and preparation
 - Parenting skills
 - Budgeting
- Linkage to Educational Opportunities:
 - GED Preparation
 - Post-Secondary Education
 - Vocational Education
- Assistance in job preparation and attainment
- Mental Health Services
